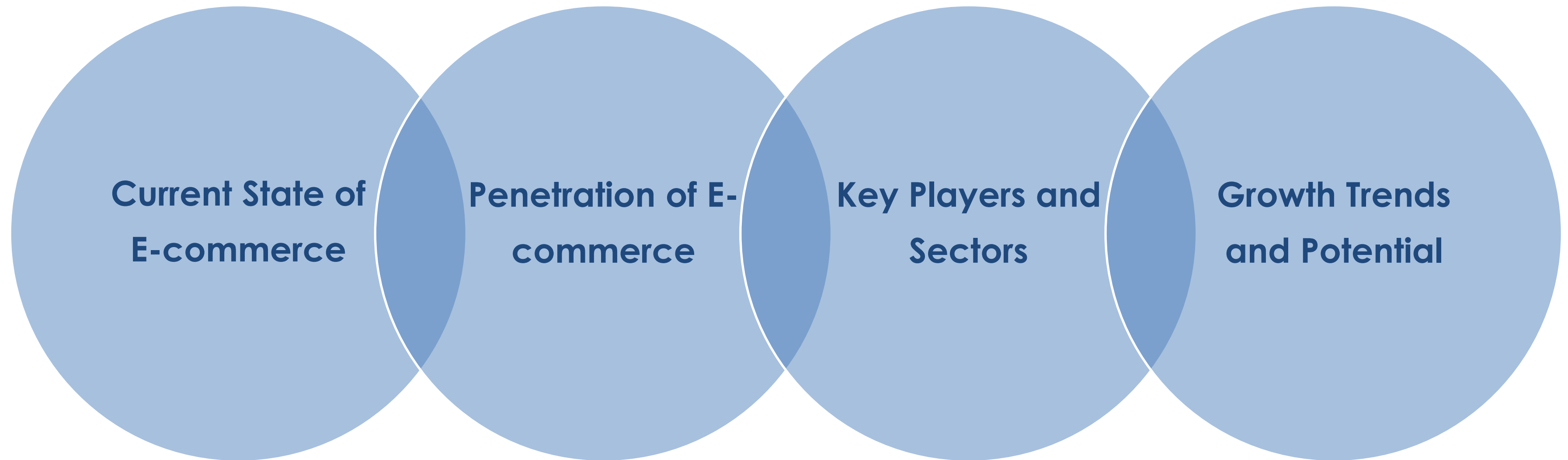

INTRODUCTION

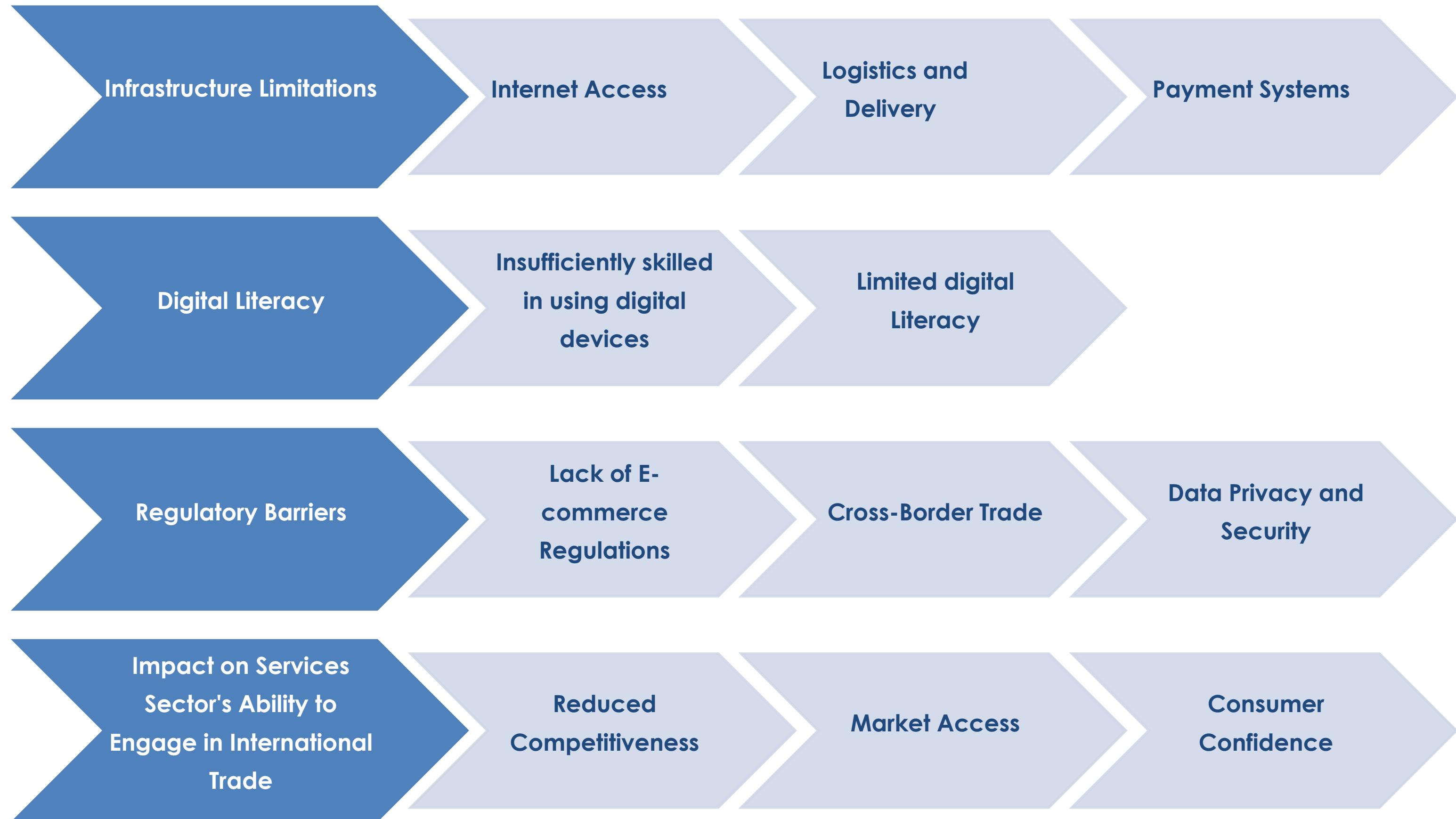
